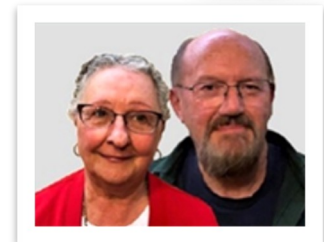

Corvair Cooks Corner

Dessert Cheese Ball

Taken from: the Corvair Minnesota November 2021 newsletter, the "Leaky SEEL" member, Gail Quinn. Thank you to Gail for this recipe.



INGREDIENTS:

- 1 8 oz. pkg full-fat cream cheese
- 8 Tablespoons unsalted butter
- 1 Teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1 Cup powdered sugar
- 1½ Cups chocolate **fudge** brownie mix, dry
- 1½ Miniature chocolate chips, separated
- ½ Cup toffee bits
- Dippers of your choice

Note 1: More brownie mix can be added as well as chocolate chips and chopped Heath bars. You can buy the bag of chopped Heath bars. You may also add more of the dry brownie mix and the packet of fudge from the box.

DIRECTIONS:

- **PREP:** It's really important that the cream cheese and butter are at room temperature. Leave cold ingredients out for 45 minutes to an hour, or [use some of these tricks to bring them to room temperature quicker](#). Do not melt either for this recipe; soften in the microwave for 10-15 seconds if needed.
- **BEAT:** In a large bowl, beat the room-temperature cream cheese and butter until completely smooth. Add in the vanilla extract, powdered sugar, and dry brownie mix (**See Note**). Mix until completely smooth.
- **ADD INS:** Stir in 1/2 cup miniature chocolate chips and the toffee bits. Mix until incorporated. The mixture will be fairly soft/wet/sticky, but don't worry; it firms up a lot during the chilling process!
- **CHILL:** Spread out a very large piece of plastic wrap. Using a spatula, scrape and scoop all the mixture into a ball on top of the plastic wrap. Wrap around the dessert ball, form into a ball, and place in the fridge to chill for 3-4 hours or until completely firm.
- **COAT IN CHOCOLATE:** Spread 1/2 cup miniature chocolate chips on a large plate. Unwrap the cheesecake ball and put on top of the chocolate chips. Use the remaining 1/2 cup chocolate chips to coat all the rest of the cheesecake ball.
- **DIPPERS:** Apple slices, Nilla wafers, Graham or Animal crackers.

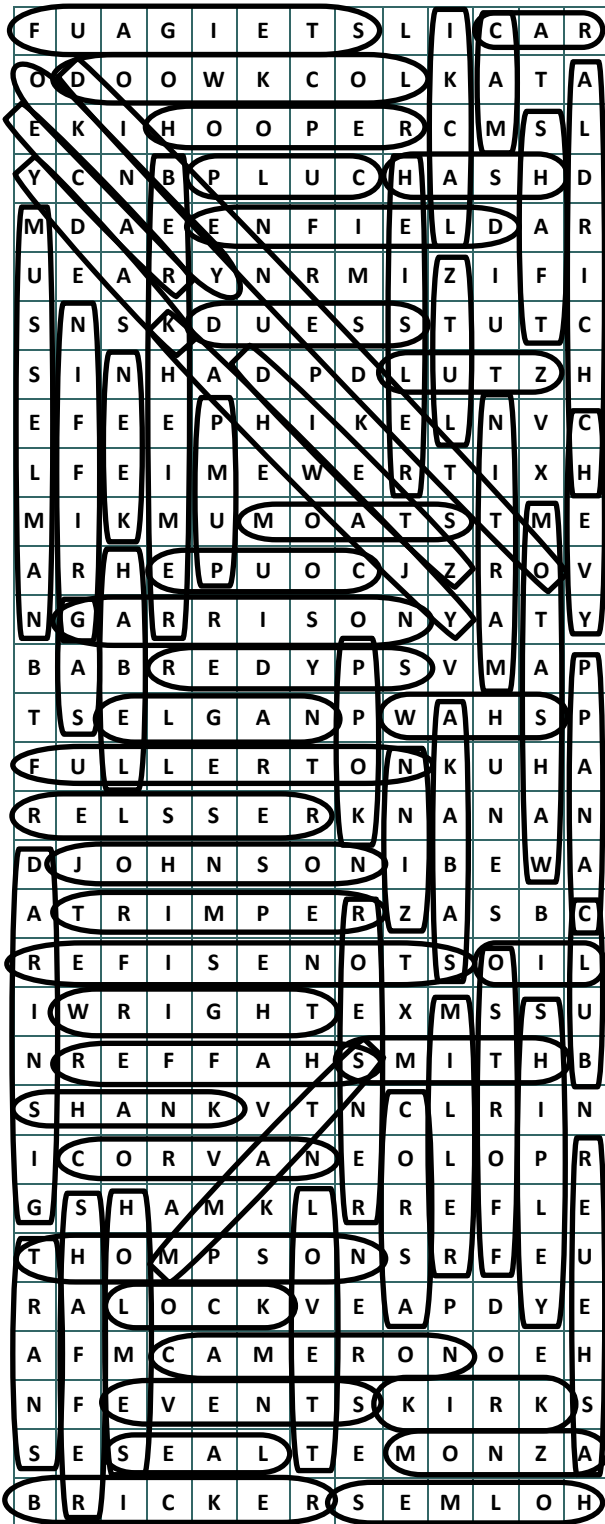

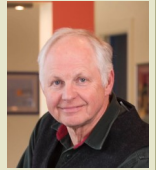

The Road Less Traveled- Pennsylvania Version

We have all heard the expression, "Take the Road Less Traveled".

Ok, but what road might that be? Well, I posed this very question to the Mgr Bureau of Planning & Research for PennDot in Harrisburg. They used their computers and general knowledge (in short, they noodled it out) to provide the answer: Keating Mountain Rd, (SR4002) with approximately 11 people along its 11 mile span.

ROAD TRIP!

Drove my Grand Cherokee (why not the Corvair? Read on...) to the start point camera in hand. First, prepping was in order- full gas tank, oil check, air pressure check, survival food, full charge for useless mobile devices, maps- paper. Ready supply of folding money and a commitment to "get 'er done".

Start Time Nov 5 1:30pm- Initially drove to the start point with whirring dust behind me. Suddenly The Turn - off SR120 in Clinton County. Crossed the Susquehanna River and stood at the



North End of Keating Mountain Road- looking South and upward- the village of Keating to my left and right. A road, I

was to discover, made of equal parts rock, dust, dirt and mud. A road handling only single lane traffic, hunters, adventures & nut jobs (like me). A road with no bridges, no guard rails, no observed wildlife, no strip malls, no cell service & no banjo music. It DID have culverts, miles of deciduous forests, major elevation changes and enough twists/turns to cause vertigo.

The first 1/2 mile climbed approx 1000ft on washboard surfaces which caused the Jeep to shake and shimmy- so glad my Corvair wasn't my ride. Rocks hit the underbody, dust covered the windows, mud caked the wheel wells. The second mile was not better. But I was now riding the ridges with great views, strong autumn colors and mountain laurel lining portions of the road. Mile after mile with one eye dodging potholes, the other eye looking for on coming vehicles and a third eye taking in the views.

When you take a trip like this the mind starts counting things of note. For example, in its 11 mile length there were 11 structures- 4 homes, 3 camps, 2 wanna be camps, 1 mansion? and 1 mysterious structure.

Potholes, washouts, loose stones/rock - too abundant to track. One vehicle headed North, 4 vehicles parked for hunting- I guess. What do people do up here? Sorry, can't answer the question



but I may not want to know anyway.

Stop Time Nov 5 2:20pm- After about 45 minutes of being jostled, bounced, twisted and traumatized the journey ended as Pottersdale appeared after a particularly ugly turn. A Corvair may have made it- but... Eleven miles of lonely bliss. Driving home on the Quehanna Highway and reflecting on the "road less traveled" makes one wonder why roads like this were built. Nevertheless my quest was completed.

Try a different road yourself. You may take your Corvair, **but** get out there and drive the car with the whirring 6 cylinder in the "wrong" end.

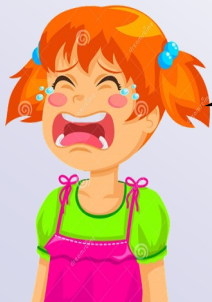
