

He mentioned to me that he had heard that my husband and I were into Corvair's and that he was looking for a Corvair engine for his airplane. I mentioned to him that we had one, but I would have Lou give him a call to discuss what he was looking for. I was sure that Lou could help Chris and we would help him find what he was looking for. Well, to make a long story short, the engine we had sitting in our garage was exactly what Chris was looking for! Thanks to Lou and Carol, I now have a complete engine for my Panther project.









RALLY: a sort of timed endurance run, in which competing cars must maintain assigned average speeds (within legal limits) over routes kept secret until the start. Rally organizers delight in thoroughly miserable roads—and fowl weather couldn't be more welcome. You've got to have an abiding faith in your car before you even enter this rally. Any flaw in handling or braking, any fault in chassis or electrical system, will be tortured out in a test far tougher than any proving ground crew could devise. A hundred and ninety-one cars started this year's Canadian Winter Rally, 43 of them in the Corvair's class. After 1,265 miles of what drivers called "North America's worst roads," nearly fifty had dropped out. But every 1963 Corvair entered came through without mechanical difficulty. Corvairs swept the top five places in its class against cars that cost up to twice as much. "You can't buy success in international competition like this. The Corvairs did so well because of the mechanical durability. Encouraging, isn't it, knowing that you can buy one of these U.S. cars that

can compete with the world's best!

# **Quick Bruschetta Recipe**

(Taken from the internet. Submitted by Carol Trimper)

Prep Time: 15 min.

Total Time: 15 min.

Servings: 24

1 French bread baguette (1 lb.) cut into 24 slices 1/2 cup prepared GOOD SEASONS Italian Dressing Mix 1/2 cup KRAFT Grated Parmesan Cheese 2 large tomatoes, chopped 2 green onions, sliced







Heat broiler.

Place bread slices in single layer on baking sheet. Broil 2 min. on each side or until golden brown on both sides.

Mix dressing and cheese until blended. Reserve 1/4 cup dressing mixture; brush remaining dressing mixture onto toast slices.

Combine tomatoes, onions and reserved dressing mixture; spoon onto toast slices just before serving.
