Angel Food Pudding Cake with Berries

Taken from Betty Crocker website

Directions:

- 1. Move oven rack to middle position. Heat oven to 350°
- 2. In large bowl, beat cake mix and water with electric mixer on low for 30 seconds, then on medium for 1 minute. Stir in sprinkles. Pour into ungreased 10-inch tube pan.
- 3. Bake 40 45 minutes or until deep golden brown. Cool completely upside down as directed on cake mix. Run knife around edges; turn cooled cake out onto cooling rack.
- 4. In large bowl, beat yogurt, 1 1/2 cups whipped topping and pudding with whisk until well blended. Cut cake in half. Tear one of the halves into bite size pieces. Place pieces in bottom of 13x9 –inch pan. Sprinkle 1 cup of the chopped strawberries evenly over cake. Pour and spread half of the yogurt filling on top. Tear other cake half into bite-size pieces and repeat layers with remaining cake pieces, chopped strawberries and yogurt filling.
- 5. When ready to serve, spread remaining 3 cups whipped topping on top of cake. Decorate top of cake using blueberries to form large star in center and sliced strawberries around edges.

CAKE: 1 Box Angel Food Cake Mix

1 1/4 cups water

1/4 cup red white, and blue sprinkles

FILLING: 4 6-oz Containers Yoplait Original strawberry yogurt

1 12-oz Container of thawed Cool Whip

1 4-oz Box vanilla instant pudding & pie filling mix

2 cups Chopped fresh strawberries

TOPPING: 1 cup fresh blueberries

1 1/2 cups sliced fresh strawberries



Ralph Nader Again......

My article on Ralph Nader in the May CPCC newsletter generated a few comments from members. He got his safety advocate fame from bashing the Corvair. Especially, the "roll over" problems on the early model Corvairs and from the lawsuits and deaths involved with cars back then. And now, his recent opening of the Tort Museum in Connecticut with a 1963 Corvair Monza coupe on a center display with a puddle of oil under the engine!

Although not very well liked by the Corvair crowd, he did do some creditable things during his years. One was featured in another VIETNAM magazine article in the 6/16 issue on page 54. "Nader weighs in:", Ralph Nader issued a report that criticized the level of GI Bill payments provided to Vietnam vets. Consumer rights activist, Ralph Nader, offered further evidence of the veterans difficulties when he commissioned an extensive investigation into the Vietnam veterans experience. Published in 1973 as "The Discarded Army: Veterans After Vietnam. The Nader report on Vietnam veterans and the Veterans Administration." Commonly called the Nader Report, it explained the federal response to the problems of Vietnam veterans with particular emphasis on the role of the Veterans Administration.

So, now we have Ralph Nader, Vietnam veterans, and "Corvair." I won't get into the Nader versus VW, that's another story......




















Tony Dow reunited with his 1962 Chevrolet Corvair after 51 years

Leave it to ... Alan?

Actor Tony Dow has been reunited with an old friend that he never expected to see again.

Not Jerry Mathers -- the two "Leave it to Beaver" stars are still in touch. In 1961, Dow purchased the midnight blue 1962



Chevrolet Corvair Spyder while he was working as a young actor on the iconic sitcom, which ran from 1957 to 1963. Dow drove the Corvair for about four years before selling it to a Universal Studios

prop builder. Dow never expected to see the car again, but Alan Dadisman, the Universal Studios employee, kept it for more than 50 years.

The San Diego Union Tribune reported that the 71-year-old Dow was recently contacted at his home near Malibu, Calif., by a man named Marty Tryon who informed the actor that Dadisman had passed away earlier this year, but left specific instructions to track Dow down and give him his old car back. "At first I thought this guy was kidding," Dow told the Union-Tribune. "Who keeps a car for 51 years, then goes to the effort to try to find its former owner to give it back?" .


Nearly 30 years ago, the car was restored to its original glory. Originally blue, the car is now painted black and has a new 180 hp turbocharged engine from a later Corvair. It hasn't run in several years, but Dow plans to have it refurbished and start driving it again.

Early Engine Mount by Kirk Wilson, North Texas Corvair Assn.

Before you change the rear motor mount on your early model ('61-'64) car, you should know that the mount is comprised of three pieces: the molded rubber mount, a bolt spacer assembly, and the frame. If you don't have all three of these parts, make sure that you get them. If you don't, you will be courting early motor mount failure.

Changing an Oil Filters by Bob Kirman

Some of you members newly acquainted with Corvairs, and some of you old-timers with much oil on your driveway, may not know this oil filter removal trick. Get a plastic bag that doesn't leak and pull it up around the filter. Loosen the top bolt, and remove the filer in the bag. That way you don't have oil running down into the lower shroud, and coming up to you via the heater ducts.

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
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
