Sweet Potato Harvest Medley



Ingredients:

1 Pound Sweet Potatoes
 Oil
 3 Apples
 1 Small Can Mandarin Oranges
 ¼ - ½ Cup Brown Sugar
 ½ Cup each of Raisins & Cranberries
 1 tsp. Cinnamon
 Chopped Walnuts or Pecans

Directions:

Peel, if desired, small, long sweet potatoes and slice ¼ inch thick. Place into a skillet (medium high heat) with enough oil to coat the bottom of the pan. Fry on both sides for five to seven minutes, reducing heat to low medium. Peel (if desired) and chunk apples and add to skillet. Add the juice of a small can of mandarin oranges and/or orange juice. Add desired amount of brown sugar, depending on taste preferences. Add raisins and cranberries. Simmer 5 to 10 minutes over low heat. Add cinnamon. Cover and simmer until apples are soft. Add mandarin oranges for the last three minutes.

Optional: Add chopped walnuts or pecans.

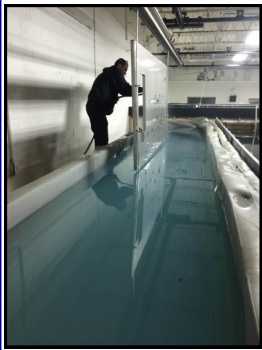
Finally... A Local Chrome Plating Shop

I mentioned a little about this place at the May meeting. But I didn't have a lot of pertinent information to pass onto the members. I went up today to see the shop and talked to the owners and here is what I learned!

It is **B&B Metal Finishing Inc., Plating Specialists**, 401 N. Main St., Manchester, PA 17345. Their website is: www.bbmetalfinishing.com, email is: bbmetal@ptd.net, and phone number: 717-764-8941.



They have big dipping/chroming tanks for large items like bumpers, bike chassis, headers, axles, etc. correct 3-step nickel/chrome plating. They do different color anodizing, chrome, and nickel plating. Stainless steel and aluminum polishing. They do not repair

damage to bumpers, grilles, or trim. It must be good condition and ready for plating. If you can't get there you can email a picture of your item(s) you want plated and they will give you a quote. They will tell you if it is too pitted and they can't do it!



Check their website for additional information. They do small items like bolts, nuts, etc. Wayne Bushey of the National Nova Club is in there often to get bolts, nuts, washers, and small

items they use for Nova restorations. Aaron Schwartz, part owner, will welcome the club for a free tour later in the year as they are extremely busy right now. This would be a good Fall or Winter tour activity. Check it out.....

Like many days this spring, the weather on April 30th did not look promising. Cool and cloudy with a chance of showers was what the weatherman called for. It was a little cool and cloudy, but the showers held off during the day. We met at the Wrightsville Rutter's to begin our cruise to the Hans Herr House and tour. We had eight travelers: Dale and Anne Geiman, John Berkheimer, Paul Brown, John and Sandy Johnson, and Rich Heisler and his granddaughter, Jenna. There were three Corvair's, the Johnsons, Paul Brown, and the Heisler's on the cruise. Hans Herr was one of the earliest settlers in Lancaster County and is credited with beginning the Mennonite Church in this area. The guide took us on a tour of the

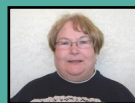
original house providing us with an insight to the way the people of this era lived. They have done a very good job of maintaining the house and grounds. I would say the lifestyle was more functional than fancy. Despite the hardships, Pennsylvania offered some things missing in Europe at the time, among them, religious freedom and cheap, fertile land. This became the overwhelming driving force during the German migrations in the 1700's. After touring the Hans Herr Homestead, we walked across the street to a recreation of a Long House used by the Native Americans of this era. A Long House was a wooden frame about 30' x 60' covered with bark. As many as 12 families lived in each Long House with several Long Houses clustered together to make a village. The interior was furnished to recreate how the Native American lived. One thing of note was the fact that EVERY part of the animal was

used and everyone shared in the harvest. The one person that seemed to be the most interested in the tours was Jenna, Rich's granddaughter. She had many questions and was a delightful addition to our group. After the tours we proceeded to the Willow Street Restaurant for lunch. The food was good and so was the company. Corvair people are naturals at eating, visiting, and laughing, in other words, just enjoying the day with friends.

Tom Zinn is already hard at work on our next Cruise and tour, scheduled for June. From what I have heard from the planning, it is going to be a fun day. Tom will give the particulars in his article. I encourage everyone to participate. Please remember to let Tom know ahead of time so he can plan the stops.

Anyone interested in a roll bar for late models?
[Welcome to Rhodes Race Cars - Your One Stop Chassis Shop](#) has one available for \$174.95 plus \$100 shipping (over size freight). It is a 4 point drag race or road race, they do have available 4-6-8 point also. (Compared to Clark's roll bar price at Street C5299 \$472.70, or Race C5300 at \$559.00. Their shipping can be \$150 to \$250 (over size freight)). Quite a difference in prices here!

Rock Auto, [RockAuto](#) has a Hi-Performance air filter for \$8. They are for '64-'69 Corvairs. Plus, these AC Delco A178CWF for \$4.57, Fram TGA192 Tough Guard for \$8.12. SOLUTION: Encase the Corvair in a solid block of shatter-resistant acrylic, which will have the added benefit of stopping further leaks from happening.

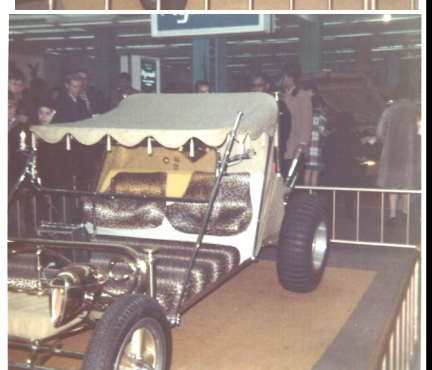
