

Since we did not nearly finish the intended tour, it was decided to perhaps, continue the outing at a later date. That possibility will be discussed at an upcoming monthly meeting.

I would now like to give some information on our next Cruise. On Saturday, June 17th Ron and Betty Hash have prepared a cruise to some of the less traveled areas in Southern York County with our first stop at Maple Lawn Farm, home to their own winery, ice cream shop, fruit market and bake shop. We will then travel to Muddy Creek Forks to take a train ride and tour the historic grounds. Last, but not least, we will have lunch before heading home. The plan is to meet at Home Depot in Shrewsbury, PA at 9:30

AM. We will assemble in the eastern corner of their parking lot, away from the main entrance. We will then caravan to Muddy Creek Forks, do the tours and train ride then have lunch around 1:30 PM outside of Delta. Ron and Betty have provided a specific schedule, of the days' activities and it is included in this Newsletter. Directions to Home Depot are listed below:

From Hanover: Follow Rt 216 East to Rt 851 East (1st stop sign past Codorus Park). Continue on Rt 851 through Shrewsbury and travel "under" I-83. At the 2nd light AFTER going under I-83, turn left into Stonebridge (Cracker Barrel on your left). Turn left at the first street past the Cracker Barrel entrance. The entrance to Home Depot is at the top of the hill. We will be on the left when you enter the parking lot.

From Red Lion: Take Rt 24 south towards Stewartstown. Take the first right, 100 yards past Winterstown Fire Company then drive 50 yards and turn left on Mt Olivet road. Follow Mt Olivet Road, 4 miles to a 4-way stop intersection. Turn right onto Plank Rd travel 1½ miles to the second road on your left and bear left ("Y") onto Mt Airy Rd. Travel 100 yards and turn left onto Wolfe Road. Follow Wolfe Road 2 miles to the stop sign. Turn right onto Far Hills Drive, Home Depot is on your right.

From Lancaster: Take I-83 south to Exit 4. Turn left onto Rt 851 East and go to the 2nd light turn left into Stonebridge. Take the first road past the Cracker Barrel entrance and turn left to Home Depot, on your left. You could also take the Rt 24 exit off US 30 and travel south through Red Lion to Winterstown and follow the Red Lion directions.

The Maryland and Pennsylvania Railroad, affectionately known as the Ma & Pa, connected Baltimore and York on a narrow-gauge line that traced a meandering, scenic 77-mile route. In the days before modern highways and automobiles, it was an indispensable link between rural communities and the outside world. The village at Muddy Creek Forks sits along the railroad line. It is being preserved as an example of a typical railroad community in the steamengine era. A project of the Maryland & Pennsylvania Railroad Preservation Authority, it depicts what it was like to live in the 'Forks' in 1915. Many buildings survive from that era. Work continues on restoration of the general store, post

office, roller mill, grain elevator, farm buildings, creamery and a 1900 railroad station.

Come with us to visit the authentic circa 1900's historic Ma & Pa Railroad Heritage Village at Muddy Creek Forks in York County, Pennsylvania.

What to Do at the Heritage Village:

- ⇒ Ride the Train
- ⇒ Explore Village Buildings

Refreshments along with souvenirs and gifts are for sale. You can also tour our

grain elevator, roller mill, and view other outbuildings: scale house, corn cribs, barn and cannery ruins. They have an original Ma & Pa caboose along with our recently acquired EMD diesel #82.



In addition, there are train rides on the maintenance train. Picnic tables are available along with a large wrap-around porch to just sit and enjoy the scenery.

Near by is the Wallace-Cross Mill. One of the few water-powered grist mills remaining in York County. Along with the mill, there are nearby the famous Maple Lawn Farms Orchard and Corn Maze Park.

Just down the road are many wonderful eating establishments.
