- 3/4 c. Sugar
- 2 Eggs
- I Tbsp. Lemon Juice
- I Tsp. Vanilla 24 Vanilla Wafers
- I (21 oz) Can Cherry Pie Filling

DIRECTIONS:

- Beat cream cheese, sugar, eggs, lemon juice, and vanilla until fluffy.
- Line muffin/cupcake pans with baking papers.

The Coolest Car That No Longer Exists: the 1954 Corvette Corvair!

This 1954 Corvette Corvair concept car recreates the beauty of a Chevrolet that's been lost to history.

The idea of concept cars (or the concept This particular 1954 Corvette was hand of idea cars?) has been around a long time. A concept car is a great way to gauge people's reaction to new and sometimes revolutionary car designs, which was even truer before the advent of the internet. And, after all, it's a lot cheaper to build a few than to commit to a full production year of a car that may turn out to be a dud.



WHAT HAPPENS TO CONCEPT CARS WHEN THEY ARE DONE BEING SHOWN-OFF?

Sadly, most concept cars are lost. Why? Well, since most don't carry real VIN numbers, they can't be sold or even driven the manufactures have to either pay to 2015. store them or just send them to the crusher after being stripped of any useful bits. Some manage to survive due to sneaky employees, and some notable ones have been put into the historic collections of manufacturers, but typically they just cease to exist. Such was the case with the original 1954 Corvette Corvair concept cars. It seems that five (a number open to WHY DIDN'T GM EVER PRODUCE THE debate) were built by GM to show off the fastback body style, and the first one was unveiled at the 1954 Motorama Show held at the Waldorf-Astoria in New York, GM loved to do variations of their new Corvette, including a convertible, a sporty fastback, and a sweet two-door station wagon. Most just faded away, although the station wagon ultimately morphed into a full-size ride called the Nomad. The fastback body style shown here carried on, but was produced as an entirely different car than the one with four seats, rear-mounted engine, and futuristic design that you see here, called the Corvair (a portmanteau of "Corvette" and "Bel Air").



built to replicate the Motorama Corvair coupe, and was constructed by Brett Henderson of Blue Flame Restorations, with every effort taken to faithfully replicate the concept car. It's fitted with an original 1956 rear-end and a set of AC Delco shocks, as well as original 1954 front suspension and steering parts. Front disc brakes help it stop more assuredly, while the 265ci (4.3-liter) V-8 engine is fed by a Holley four-barrel carburetor and is disappearing act. backed by a 700R four-speed automatic transmission linked to a two-speed Powerglide shifter. The 15-inch steel wheels are wrapped with a period-correct set of Firestone whitewall tires, lending it even more period-correct originality. Finished in a fresh coat of Crystal Red, the interior uses custom-designed Al Knoch bucket seats, custom window glass, gauges from a 1956 installed in the factory 1954 dashboard, and more. Entered into the 2015 Amelia Island Concours d'Elegance, the car was also named a personal favorite by legendary custom car builder George

CORVETTE CORVAIR?

When the 1953 Corvette was released to the public, its styling and fiberglass construction were groundbreaking, but just 300 were sold. It looked amazing, but compared to the sports cars coming out of Europe, competitive performance was sadly missing from the mix, partly due to the Blue Flame inline-six-cylinder engine and two-speed Powerglide automatic transmission. With no manual transmission to compete with German, Italian, and British offerings, the Corvette wasn't a viable choice for many. As such, sales were lackluster, and Chevrolet was considering killing off the Corvette.

Enter Zora Arkus-Duntov (remember him and his Ardun flathead Ford OHV engine kit?). Zora knew a few things about performance and had grand ideas about adding V-8 engines and manual transmissions to the Corvette so it could better-compete in the sports car segment. However, his rescue of the Corvette didn't happen fast enough to save the Corvette Corvair design, and the concept cars were sent into oblivion. The red one replicated here vanished right after the Motorama show, and a Seafoam Green version (some say it was in fact the same car, repainted) was shown around the country before pulling the same



Sizing Corvair Wheels and Tires

One of the things that many people do to make their Corvairs faster or more distinctive is to install different wheels and tires, a task that can be very frustrating if you just try to put on whatever seems to fit. This article originally appeared as a four month series in the Hot Air Mail (Northern Virginia Corvair Club's newsletter) and is an attempt to help Corvair enthusiasts properly fit non stock wheels and tires, whether new or used. Thanks to the members of the Northern Virginia Corvair Club for their input in writing this article, and the members of Virtual Vairs for many of the additions and refinements.

Since so many folks change the wheel and tire combination on their street cars, I've now broken this page into two sections, street and competition.

Street Tires

- Let's look at street tires first. I use and recommend only radial tires, so that's what this information covers. The size radial closest to a stock 6.50-13 bias ply is 185/80R13, but unless you have a factory stock show car, you may wish to use a different size. Most major tire manufacturers make several different types of tires, so to decide which of these types and in what size it helps to realistically decide how much money you want to spend and what kind of use you'll put them to. Answering the following questions usually helps:
 - O How well do you want the car to ride?
 - O How much do you drive your Corvair?
 - Is stock appearance important?
 - Is all-weather ability important?
 - O you want more cornering grip?
 - ◊ Will the tires be used for autocross or other.

The following dimensions will affect your decision in various ways, so keep the following in mind:

- Width: A wider tire will generate somewhat more grip but is more likely to hydroplane, and may hit various parts of the car if the wheel size is not optimum. Also, if you want tires wider than 205mm, you must get wider wheels.
- **Profile:** A lower profile tire has more grip (because it deflects less), but the ride will be stiffer.
- **Speed Rating:** Generally unnecessary on U.S. roads, but higher speed ratings are an indication of a more sporting tire.
- Wheel Diameter: If it isn't 13 inches, you will need non stock wheels.
- Overall Height: This affects the gearing, speedometer, and ride height. Note that the height of the tire off the car is not the same as the rolling diameter, since loading, construction, and air pressure affect the height. Although you can't easily measure this dimension, you can find often find it as part of the tire specifications, expressed a couple

different ways: \cdot Loaded radius. Stock is 11.8" (to 65) and 12.1" for 7.00-13 (66-69 and wagons), or: \cdot Revolutions per mile. Stock is 853 (to 65) and 833 (66-69 and wagons) revs/ mile, according to Chevy specs. Oddly enough, the calibration for the speedometer doesn't quite match - the '66 up speedos are set for 825 revs/mile.

If you'd like to measure a tire, you need to have it mounted and on a car. Make a mark on the bottom of the tire, roll the car through ten revolutions and measure the distance the car traveled. Divide by ten, then two times pi (6.28) and you'll have the loaded radius.

If you're buying new tires, bear in mind that there is some tolerance in the specification for a given size, you should check with the tire dealer to be sure what the real dimensions are of the tires you want. Also, after seeing the many sizes that folks have used and ended up with accurate speedometers, it is obvious that although stock speedometers may have been correct when new, now that they are over forty years old they are likely to be a bit off. The tires that produced good results with my car are technically a bit short. The upshot of this is that once you have selected your tires, you should do an odometer check of at least ten miles, and if possible a speed check as well (one mile per minute at 60 MPH, do three or more miles if possible).

Having said all that, I surfed over to The B.F. Goodrich site to come up with some examples of tires that would work well on Corvairs. They have data sheets for all of their tires there, I used the specs from the Radial T/A here, other models will be a bit different. You should be aware that the sizes are a range, so it's a good idea to get the data sheet if you can, especially if you have chosen a size near the limit of what will fit. Unfortunately, BFG doesn't offer a 13" Radial T/ A that will work well, these are 14, 15 and 16 inch:

- P185/70R14 (all)
- P195/70R14 (all, good replacement for 1960 65 6.50-13)
- P205/70R14 (all, good replacement for 1966 69 7.00-13)
- P205/55R15 (all)
- P195/60R15 (all, good replacement for 1960 65 6.50-13)
- P195/65R15 (all, good replacement for 1966 69 7.00-13)
- P205/60R15 (all, good replacement for 1966 69 7.00-13)
- P205/55R16 (a little tall, may rub on an early, fits lates).

Late models have a little more room in the rear, you could use these sizes on the rear of a late if you want the "big and little" look:

·P225/60R14 · P235/60R14 · P215/60R15 · P225/50R16
