Keystone Corvair Travel - Highlights & Tips (Part 1)

Want to try something different driving your Corvair in Pennsylvania? Me too. What are the possibilities? Let's have a look:

Like heights? Go to Mt Davis in Somerset County. At 3213 feet it is the highest point in the state. **And** you can drive to the very top. Want higher? Go up the nearby fire station outlook- you'll need good legs plus your binoculars. Don't like heights? Head to the Delaware River which, at sea level, is the lowest point in the state.

Like bridges? What will be one of the longest bridges (4545 ft) in PA upon completion is part of the CSVT (Central Susquehanna Valley Transportation) in 2022. This standard post and beam bridge will be across the West Branch of the Susquehanna River in Union and Northumberland Counties. It spans starts at Winfield & ends at PA147 just North of Lewisburg. The bridge is

currently under construction- see it whilst it is new. Want still more bridges? Alleghany County has more bridges - an astounding 1188 bridges than any other county. Don't like bridges- go to Cameron County- only 68 bridges the least number in all 67 counties. PA has 25393 bridges 8 feet or more- plenty to drive your Corvair over.

Even though the state may be politically polarized, you and your Corvair can strike a centralist view by going to the very geographic center of Pennsylvania located in Centre County at N40 52.500, W77 48.167. It is on State Game Land 333- good luck finding it- take hiking shoes. Do a quick check on people's political persuasion upon arrival- good luck with that.

Want to test your Corvair's brakes? Head to Canton Ave in Pittsburg at a very steep grade of 37% - the steepest street in PA. A close

second is Dornbush Street at 32% grade also in Pittsburgh. Want to experiment your with your 'Vair's durability? Then try State Rte 144 between Snow Shoe and South Renovo- it has the least "human habitation" in the state. No phone signal, no people, no nuttin. Break down at your peril. Fortunately, this section is "only" about 30 miles long. Perhaps even more remote is the Hammersley Wild Area a 30,253-acre wild area in the Susquehannock State Forest in Potter and Clinton Counties in north-central PA. Although there is limited driving of the 'Vair in the forest you can walk. Collect your thoughts in absolute peace.

Not enough travel variety? Stay tuned for Part 2 where a discussion of other opportunities will arise. For Part 2 destinations make sure your Corvair is "weather worthy" and you are a lonely sort of person!

STOP THOSE PESKY FUEL LINE LEAKS

STOP THOSE PESKY FUEL LINE LEAKS

The 45° are fittings used on fuel system connections work very well when they are new. However, after repeated dis-assembly and reassembly, the things wear and the Ares become distorted. As the parts wear, getting them to seal becomes increasingly more difficult. First we over tighten them. Then we resort to Teflon tape, liquid thread sealer, or even custom made rubber washers. SAE flares are not designed to seal at the threads. Gas softens Teflon and bits and pieces can clog the fuel supply. Thread sealer can make things even more difficult to separate, if it seals. Rubber washers can soften and even dissolve if the material is not gas resistant. There is a readily available item that will compensate for wear and allow new and used 45° fittings to seal without excessive tightening. Commonly used in air conditioning, 45° copper are gaskets are available in 1/4" and 5/16" sizes to fit Corvair fuel lines. Manufactured by Parker-Hannifin, they are available from multiple vendors on-line. Local refrigeration or industrial suppliers may also be a source. 2GF-4 is the number for the 1/4" and 2GF-5 for the 5/16".

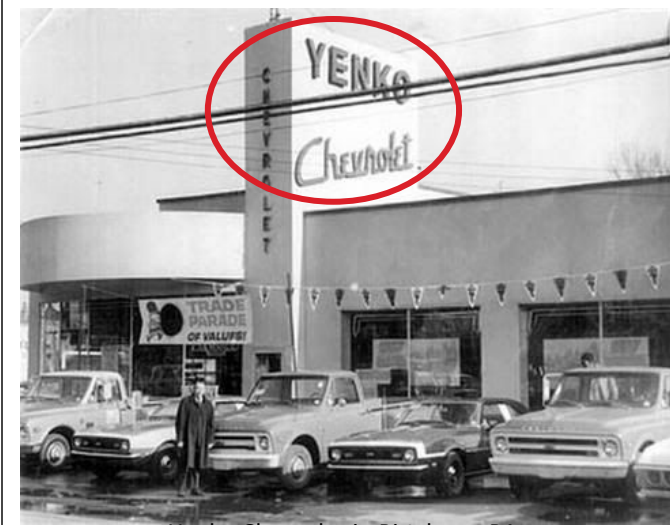

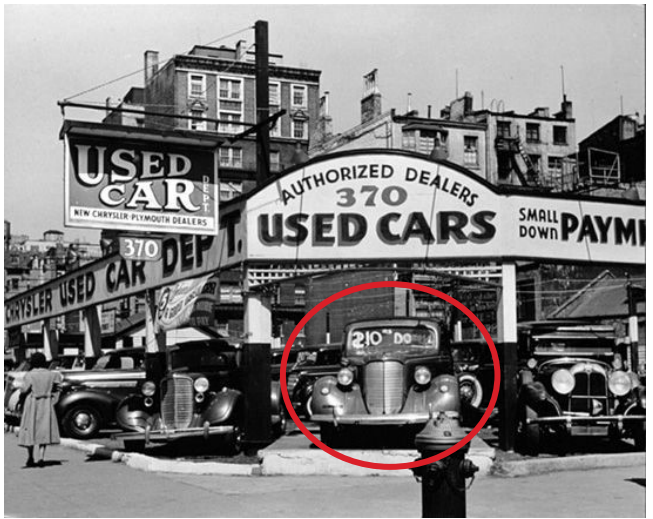

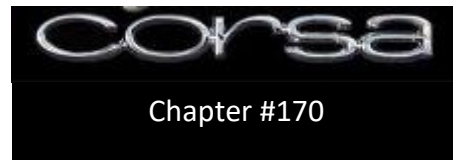
Central Pennsylvania Corvair Club
