How to Effectively Freeze Vegetables

Taken from the Merchandiser 2022 Edition of Classic Recipe Magazine

Large packages of meat and poultry can be broken down and frozen easily. But what about the fresh produce that many people rely on for important nutrients? Fresh vegetables only last so long, so learning how to safely freeze fresh vegetables to avoid throwing them out is essential.

To freeze vegetables properly so they retain their flavor and texture, it is important to freeze them within a few hours of picking them from a garden or taking them home.

Certain vegetables can be frozen in their raw state. The texture might change slightly upon thawing, but they will remain flavorful. Other vegetables may require blanching before freezing. Blanching requires scalding vegetables in boiling water or steam for a brief time. Blanching helps stop the enzymes that cause vegetables to decay, a process that can occur even in frozen storage. Items that do well with blanching include,

spinach, kale, winter squash, and broccoli.

Another way to freeze produce is to remove the air that can compromise the food. You can do so by filling containers or bags and pushing out the extra air. Vacuum sealers can work to remove the air and help preserve items in the freezer longer; otherwise, use a tray pack method to freeze items. Place chilled and drained blanched vegetables in shallow trays or pans. Freeze them until the vegetables are firm and then quickly fill freezer bags or containers, says the National Center for Home Food Preservation.

Remember to label and date all containers so items can be used in order in which they were packed. Most vegetables maintain high quality for 8-12 months at 0 F or lower.

Freezing fresh vegetables is an option when stocking up on essential foods. Flavor and texture can be retained and items will not need to be discarded before they can be eaten.

Checking Alternators off of the Car and on the Car

The '65 Shop Manual has a very good explanation of testing alternators and adjusting regulators, however most of the text and photographs are from a full size Chevy, so keep that in mind. I have tried to condense the information and add some personal experience to create a "quick check".

Checking Alternators off of the car (such as at a swap meet) can be done with an ohm meter. The following is a pretty reliable test that I have used, but there can always be something new so do

some research if this guide does not cover your situation.

The following checks were done while looking at the end opposite the fan.

Alternators with external regulators (OEM):

Checking an alternator with an external regulator while running:

With engine warmed up, attach a voltmeter between the output stud and case, and run engine at 1500 rpm (top step of fast idle cam): charging voltage should be 13.5 to 15. If voltage is no higher than battery voltage, check the alternator by removing the four wire connector from the regulator and make a jumper (see on next page) between the red wire and the blue wire (full battery voltage to the field). The alternator should load and voltage output should jump. Do not let the

voltage approach 20 or you will burn out miniature bulbs. If nothing happens, the alternator is bad. You have provided the alternator field with full battery voltage, bypassing the regulator.

Checking an alternator with an internal regulator while running:

With engine warmed up and running at 1500 rpm (top step of fast idle cam), attach a voltmeter between the output stud and the case; charging voltage should be 13.5-15. If the voltage is battery voltage you can full field the alternator (bypassing the regulator) by inserting a small pick or screwdriver straight through the hemispherical shaped hole opposite the output stud and ground the internal regulator tab against the case. The alternator should load and the voltage should jump. Do not exceed 20v or miniature bulbs will burn out. If the voltage jumps then you have a bad regulator. No adjustments to the regulator are possible but they can be replaced.




Brake Adjusters

Self-adjusting brakes work fine if all the pieces are in good order and are assembled correctly. The various illustrations in my 1965 service manual concerning these items are less than completely clear, and in fact, they appear to be in error. The actuator partially obstructs the view of the spring holding the bottom of the shoes together. When incorrectly installed, as shown in the top drawing (next column), this spring places excessive pressure on the star wheel, which the actuator cannot overcome. prevents proper self-adjusting operation. The bottom drawing (next column) shows proper installation of this spring, as stated in the manual "the adjusting screw spring inserted to prevent interference with the star wheel."

The star wheel assembly will, over the years, accumulate dirt and become quite



stiff and difficult to turn. When re-doing your brakes, be sure to take this thing apart and thoroughly clean the threads. This will allow it to respond properly when the actuator applies its force. Also note while doing this cleaning that on the end of the star wheel there is a letter R or L. This means right and left, and refers to the side of the vehicle where the part should be installed.

Do You Have a Tech Question? (Taken from CORSA

Communique, August 1995, Vol 17, Number 8, page 14)

Q: I would like to put seat belts in my 1961 Monza sedan for the safety of my family. I have already installed one in the middle of the back seat because my son has to ride in a child's car seat. For this installation, I went to the junkyard and pulled a GM seat belt out of the back of a late 1960s car, then reinstalled it using the same bolts and large washer for added strength. But for the front seat, I would like something more original and the proper place to install them; any ideas?

I have read a lot about the safety of this car. Most of what I have read leads me to believe that if I keep the proper tire pressure, this car is reasonably safe. At this point, I am running nylon tires and have hear that the radials will improve handling. Any tips out there? Is there anything I should purchase for this car to improve its safety?

Do you have a checklist of things that would help a newcomer to keep that Corvair running at its peak?

A: Answer came from the Executive Editor, Mike McGowan. In 1961, Chevrolet did not install mounting holes for seat belts. The only dealer accessory belt offered was a universal length gray belt for all Chevrolets, with instruction for drilling mounting holes. You'll never find these now, so just get some universal belts later Corvair/ Chevrolet belts and copy the mounting locations from a 1962-1964 Corvair CORSA show judges will not penalize you for putting safety ahead of originality.

Ralph Nader was wrong. The Corvair is safe. You should heed the factory recommendation to have more pressure in the rear tires than the front ones, and most Corvair enthusiasts increase the pressure in all tires by 4-8 psi. And yes, radial tires will greatly improve the handling. Get four, of course, in a size 175180R13 or 185170R13.


The Chevrolet shop manual is a good place to start for checking the service intervals and lubrication.
