an open field in a convertible. I have no idea what color since we still had a black and white TV. I was smitten! I cannot explain it, but it was love at first sight. That was the beginning of what was to become a lifetime love affair with the Corvair. I remained "carless" throughout my teen years, but when I graduated from high school, I needed a car to get me to college. I was a commuter because I couldn't afford to live on campus. My father and I searched used car lots for

weeks for a reliable car that would get me through the 72 mile round trip to York College five days a week, in all weather conditions. In August, 1966, I found a 4 speed, dark green, saddle interior 1963 Monza Coupe with 40,000 miles in Lancaster and bought it. My first car and it was a Corvair. That car served me faithfully for 2 years getting me to college and surviving many adventures a teenager finds himself in.

I will continue this story in other newsletters, but please share yours as well. I find it very interesting reading other people's stories about their cars. TECH TIP

Here are some of the tools I highly recommend you invest in for the maintenance of your Vair; you can easily find them anywhere, and they are not expensive:

1 - **Timing light**, you always hook it up to number 1 spark plug wire to set your timing, normally comes with instructions...

2 - **Dwell meter**, dang, this gizmo sure makes things easy when you want to check your voltage, your rpm, set the dwell/set your points, normally at 30 to 31 degrees. You can set them by yourself by using a remote ignition, that will allow you to spin your engine when you set the dwell.

3 - **Carburetor synchronizer**, will allow to set your carburetors the correct way, without guessing and wasting time. Don't forget to disconnect the clip that secures the little arm connected to the carburetor crossover linkage on the driver side. I know that many guys out there like to build their own devices, like a plastic bottle with water and a vacuum hose, what the hell, are we smoking grass, or what, LOL?? Don't be cheap and get the right tools, available in our store, under "tools".



For more tune-up details and for more specifications, refer to your Corvair shop manual, it is the Bible for Vairs....I strongly recommend to get one, and they are available for sale as well, go to the 'manual and posters' section.... all right, peace out, and I know you can do it! Corvair **Cooks** Corner

Shrimp Scampi

Taken from Food Network



Ingredients

- 1 pound angel hair pasta
- 2 tablespoons olive oil
- 1 pound large shrimp, peeled and deveined
- 4 cloves garlic, minced
- 1/2 teaspoon red pepper flakes
- 1 lemon, juiced, plus 1/2 lemon, zested
- 1/2 cup dry white wine
- 5 tablespoons butter

Directions

- Add the pasta to a large pot of boiling salted water, over medium heat, and cook until al dente.
- Meanwhile, heat a large 12-inch skillet over medium-high heat. Add the olive oil. Once shimmering and hot, add the shrimp and sauté until just cooked through, about 2 to 3 minutes. Remove to a plate and reserve. Add the garlic and red pepper flakes to the skillet, then sauté for until the garlic is fragrant, about 1 minute. Add the lemon juice and white wine and raise the heat to high. Let the liquid reduce for 2 to 3 minutes. Whisk in the butter, add a ladleful of the pasta cooking water and return the shrimp. Remove from the heat.
- Drain the pasta in a colander, and add it to the skillet along with the chopped parsley and toss. Add the lemon zest and adjust the seasonings with salt and pepper, to taste. Transfer to a serving platter and serve immediately.
