TECH TIP Taken from internet Corvair 101 The New Generation

These are some of the tools I highly recommend you invest in for the maintenance of your Vair. You can easily find them anywhere, and they are not expensive:

- 1. Timing light, you always hook it up to number 1 spark plug wire to set your timing, normally comes with instructions.
- 2. Dwell meter, dang, this gizmo sure makes things easy when you want to check your voltage, your rpm, set the dwell/set your points, normally at 30 to 31 degrees. You can set them by yourself by using a remote ignition, that will allow you to spin your engine when you set the dwell.
- 3. Carburetor synchronizer will allow to set your carburetors the correct way, without guessing and wasting time. Don't forget to disconnect the clip that secures the little arm connected to the carburetor crossover linkage on the driver side. I know that many guys out there like to build their own devices, like a plastic bottle with water and a vacuum hose, what the hell, are we smoking grass, or what, LOL?? Don't be cheap and get the right tools, available in our store, under "tools".

For more tune-up details and for more specifications, refer to your Corvair shop manual, it is the Bible for Vairs. I strongly recommend to get one, and they are available for sale as well, go to https://www.corvair1.com/ under the 'manual and posters" Section.








Treasurer's Report for October 2019

V-P Ramblings

I have each full of **NON-ETHANOL** fuel. I am a firm believer of using nonethanol gas. I use it in just not my Corvairs, but also in my mowers and two cycle engines. I will pass on a help from the lady who maintains my two cycle engines. DO NOT MIX ETHANOL AND NON-ETHANOL GAS!!!!!! I filled my chainsaw with the non-ethanol mixture and the saw would not run. When I took it to her, she told me that I must run ALL the ethanol gas out BEFORE adding nonethanol. The two fuels do not mix cleanly

in two cycle engines. They will gum-up the screen between the tank and the engine. She emptied the tank, replaced the screen and the chainsaw ran fine. She also told me that she has not had this problem in 4 cycle engines, just the two cycle.

- Add cooked rice; simmer, uncovered, 10 minutes longer. If desired, sprinkle with chopped fresh parsley.

Test Kitchen Tips

- Dark brown sugar contains more molasses than light or golden brown sugar. The types are generally interchangeable in recipes. But if you prefer a bolder flavor, choose dark brown sugar.
- Green peppers are unripened versions of red, yellow or orange peppers. They are less expensive because they're quicker to get to market. Use colored peppers in recipes for more sweetness.
